


Job Vacancy & Wage Survey, 2nd Quarter 2022 Nova Scotia Highlights

The number of job vacancies in Nova Scotia increased by 27.1% to 23,360 in Q2 of 2022. The vacancy rate is higher than one year ago (there were 15,355 vacancies in Q1 of 2021).



- **Job vacancies** in Q2 of 2022 in Nova Scotia increased by 4,985 (+27.1%) compared to last quarter. **Job vacancy counts were unavailable for the Cape Breton region in Q2 of 2022.*
- The average offered hourly wage is \$20.50, down \$0.40 (-1.9%) compared to last quarter.
 - During the last quarter the only economic region that posted wage gains for vacant positions was the Annapolis Valley Region (+4.2%). The Southern Region fell the most (-3.5%), followed by the Cape Breton and North Shore regions (both -2.4%), and the Halifax Region (-2.1%).

The **job vacancy rate**, the number of job vacancies expressed as a percentage of labour demand (the sum of occupied and vacant jobs), increased by a full percentage point (+1.0) in Q2 of 2022 to 5.4%.
