

Job Vacancy & Wage Survey, 3rd Quarter 2023 Nova Scotia Highlights

The number of job vacancies in Nova Scotia decreased by 9.4% to 18,650 in Q3 of 2023, compared with Q2 of 2023. The job vacancy rate fell 1.1 percentage points compared to one year ago to 4.1% (there were 22,960 job vacancies in Q3 of 2022).




The **job vacancy rate**, the number of job vacancies expressed as a percentage of labour demand (the sum of occupied and vacant jobs), decreased by 0.6 percentage points in Q3 of 2023 (compared with Q2) to 4.1%.



Wages

- The average offered hourly wage is \$23.55, up \$2.75 (+13.2%) year-over-year (compared to Q3 of 2022).
- During Q3 of 2023, all five economic regions posted offered average hourly wage gains for vacant positions compared to the previous quarter: Cape Breton (\$2.60), Halifax (\$1.40), Annapolis Valley (\$1.05), North Shore (\$0.45), and Southern region (\$0.35).



 The average offered hourly wage increases, on average, with the educational requirements of the offered position.
