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
Online Job Postings in Nova Scotia – April 2024

Overview

The total number of seasonally unadjusted job postings in Nova Scotia measured by Vicinity Jobs was 8,011 during the month of April 2024. Total postings increased by 680 (+9.3%) compared to March 2024. April data is preliminary and may be revised.

During the month of April, the number of job postings by industry was highest for "health care & social assistance" followed by "retail trade" and "educational services."


Total Online Job Postings



- During the month of April 2024, there were 8,011 online job postings in Nova Scotia up 9.3% (+680 postings) from the prior month. Year-over-year, the number of postings were 3.6% lower than April of 2023, when 8,314 jobs were posted.
- The average number of postings over the trailing 12-month period (May 2023 to April 2024) was 8,149 – 2.4% lower than the average in the same period in the previous year (May 2022 to April 2023) of 8,347.


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April 2024 Online Job Postings by Economic Region



- Most online job postings in the month of April were in the Halifax economic region (4,804 postings, 62.8% of postings with identified economic regions).
- This was followed by the North Shore (13.4%), Southern (9.4%), Annapolis Valley (7.4%), and Cape Breton (7.0%) regions.
- 95.5% of job postings had identifiable economic regions.


April 2024 Online Job Postings by Industry



- The chart above contains the top ten industries by total online job postings in Nova Scotia and their offered average hourly wage over the month of April 2024.
- "Health care and social assistance" had the highest number of job postings in April. "Retail trade" was second highest, and "educational services" came in third.
- The highest average hourly wage was offered in "utilities" (\$46.82/hour), followed by "mining and oil and gas extraction" (\$35.90/hour), and "services (other than public administration) (\$33.20/hour).


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April 2024 Online Job Postings by Occupation Category



 The occupation category with the most online job postings in April was "sales and services," accounting for 35.9% of all identifiable postings, having increased by 39 postings (+1.6%) compared with March 2024.

April 2024 Online Job Postings by Skill Group




- Among online job postings, 92.9% of postings in April (7,200) required socialemotional skills.
- 86.7% of postings (6,716) listed occupational skills¹ as a requirement, followed by skills related to technologies (2,453 postings, 31.7%), and tools and equipment (1,135, 14.6%).
- Note: a posting may have requirements matching multiple skill groups.

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¹ Occupational skills are a set of knowledge and skills that employees need for a specific job or occupation.


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April 2024 Online Job Postings by Training, Education, Experience & Responsibilities (TEER) Level



- In contrast with postings by skill group, online job postings are only matched to one training, education, experience & responsibilities (TEER) level where requirements are identified. TEER levels replaced skill levels with the transition to the 2021 version of the National Occupational Classification (NOC) system.
- The most common skill level required of online job postings in April was "post-secondary education or apprenticeship program of 2 to 3 years" (accounting for 1,131 postings, 18.7% of postings with an identified TEER level), followed equally by "work demonstration and no formal education required" (1,016 postings, 16.8%), and "university degree" (1,016 postings, 16.8%), "secondary school" (998 postings, 16.5%), "post-secondary education or apprenticeship program of less than 2 years" (977 postings, 16.1%), and "management" (921 postings, or 15.2%).
- Among non-managerial postings, 80.2% of postings in April required a formal education (secondary school or higher).
- The TEER category of the remaining 1,952 job postings in April (24.4% of the total) could not be identified.

April 2024 Online Job Postings by Source



- Employer corporate websites were the main source of 45.8% of April's online job postings (3,670 postings).
- Job Bank (877 postings, 10.8%) and Indeed (166 postings, 2.1%) were also significant sources of online postings. Monster was the source of 63 job postings (0.8%).

Note: Vicinity Jobs identifies original postings and eliminates duplicate reposts.

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Appendix – TEER Categories and Examples of Jobs²

TEER	Occupation types	Examples
TEER 0	Management occupations	Advertising, marketing, and public relations managers Financial managers
TEER 1	Occupations that usually require a university degree	Financial advisors Software engineers
TEER 2	Occupations that usually require - a college diploma - apprenticeship training of 2 or more years, or - supervisory occupations	Computer network and web technicians Medical laboratory technologists
TEER 3	Occupations that usually require - a college diploma - apprenticeship training of less than 2 years, or - more than 6 months of on-the-job training	Bakers Dental assistants and dental laboratory assistants
TEER 4	Occupations that usually require - a high school diploma - several weeks of on-the-job training	Home child care providers Retail salespersons and visual merchandisers
TEER 5	Occupations that usually need short-term work demonstration and no formal education	Landscaping and grounds maintenance labourers Delivery service drivers and door-to- door distributors
