

## Online Job Postings in Nova Scotia – May 2025

#### Overview

The total number of job postings in Nova Scotia measured by Vicinity Jobs was 10,236 during the month of May 2025 (seasonally unadjusted). Total postings fell by 1,751 (-14.6%) compared to May 2024. This data is preliminary and may be revised.

During the month of May, the number of job postings by industry was highest for "health care & social assistance" and "retail trade," followed by "accommodation and food services."




## **Total Online Job Postings**

- During the month of May 2025, there were 10,236 online job postings in Nova Scotia up 12.8% (+1,163 postings) from the prior month. Year-over-year, the number of postings were 14.6% lower than in May of 2024, when 11,987 jobs were posted.
- The average number of postings over the trailing 12-month period (June 2024 to May 2025) was 8,280 - 2.0% lower than the average in the same period in the previous year (June 2023 to May 2024) of 8,449.



#### **May 2025 Online Job Postings by Economic Region**



- Most online job postings in the month of May were in the Halifax economic region (6,178 postings, 63.0% of postings with identified economic regions).
- This was followed by the North Shore (12.0%), Southern (10.1%), Cape Breton (7.4%), and Annapolis Valley (7.4%) regions.
- Economic regions were identified in 96.0% of job postings.


#### May 2025 Online Job Postings by Industry



- The chart above contains the top ten industries by total online job postings in Nova Scotia and their offered average hourly wage over the month of May 2025.
- "Health care and social assistance" (930 postings, 17.9%) had the highest number of job postings, followed by "retail trade" (913 postings, 17.5%) in May. "Accommodation and Food Services" came in third (535 postings, 10.3%).
- The highest average hourly wage was offered in "utilities" (\$42.25/hour), followed by "information and cultural industries" (\$38.24/hour) and "health care and social assistance" (\$35.51/hour).



#### May 2025 Online Job Postings by Occupation Category



 The occupation category with the most online job postings in May was "sale and services," accounting for 38.5% of all identifiable postings, followed by "business, finance and administration" (18.3%), and "trades, transport and equipment operators and related occupations" (16.1%).

#### May 2025 Online Job Postings by Skill Group




- Among online job postings, 95.0% of postings in May (9,543 postings) required social-emotional skills.
- 91.0% of postings (9,143 postings) listed occupational skills<sup>1</sup> as a requirement, followed by technological skills (3,697 postings, 36.8%), and tools and equipment (1,547 postings, 15.4%).

Note: a posting may have requirements matching multiple skill groups.



# May 2025 Online Job Postings by Training, Education, Experience & Responsibilities (TEER) Level



- In contrast with postings by skill group, online job postings are only matched to one training, education, experience & responsibilities (TEER) level where requirements are identified. TEER levels replaced skill levels with the transition to the 2021 version of the National Occupational Classification (NOC) system.
- The most common skill level required of online job postings in May was "post-secondary education or apprenticeship program (less than 2 years)" (1,491 postings, 19.5%). It was closely followed by "work demonstration and no formal education requirements" (1,358 postings, 17.7%), post-secondary education or apprenticeship program (2 to 3 years)" (1,322 postings, 17.3%), and "secondary school" (1,286 postings, 16.8%). The least common skill level required are "university degree" (1080 postings, 14.1%) and "management" (1122 postings, 14.6%).
- Among non-managerial postings, 77.2% of postings in May required a formal education (secondary school or higher).
- The TEER category of the remaining 2,577 job postings in May (25.2% of the total) could not be identified.

#### May 2025 Online Job Postings by Source



- Employer corporate websites were the main source of 49.8% of May's online job postings (5,097 postings).
- "Service Canada Jobbank" sources (713, 7.0%) were also a significant source of online postings.

# **Appendix – TEER Categories and Examples of Jobs<sup>2</sup>**

TEER	Occupation types	Examples
TEER 0	Management occupations	Advertising, marketing, and public relations managers Financial managers
TEER 1	Occupations that usually require a university degree	Financial advisors Software engineers
TEER 2	Occupations that usually require - a college diploma - apprenticeship training of 2 or more years, or - supervisory occupations	Computer network and web technicians Medical laboratory technologists
TEER 3	Occupations that usually require - a college diploma - apprenticeship training of less than 2 years, or - more than 6 months of on-the-job training	Bakers Dental assistants and dental laboratory assistants
TEER 4	Occupations that usually require - a high school diploma - several weeks of on-the-job training	Home childcare providers Retail salespersons and visual merchandisers
TEER 5	Occupations that usually need short-term work demonstration and no formal education	Landscaping and grounds maintenance labourers Delivery service drivers and door-to- door distributors
